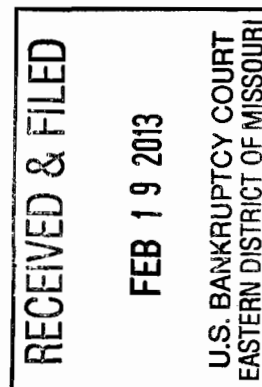


Untitled
