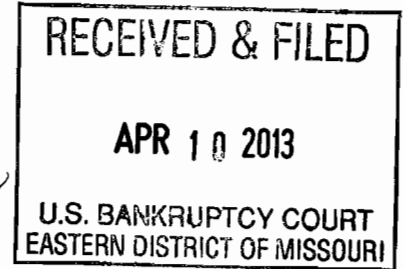

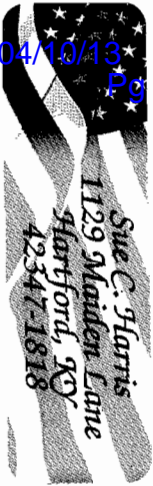

I will be 70 on September 6 this year, a diabetic and have had 4 major surgeries in the last 8 years.

I feel that if I lose my insurance that Peabody Coal Company promised for the retired workers and spouses, that I will end up having to depend on the state for medical help and a lot more, retired workers, and spouses

will have to do the same. Our economy is in very bad shape and I do not want to add to the burden of my state and have to ask for medical help, but that would be my only alternative.

I hope you can see it in your heart to help us and not let Peabody Coal Company break their promise to the retired miners and spouses.
