few doctors.

Hundreds of injured people, pregnant women, children and the elderly have poured into the squat, white building behind the control tower since Typhoon Haiyan ravaged the eastern Phil-ippines on Priday, killing thou-sands. Doctors who have been dealing with cuts, fractures and pregnancy' complications said Wednesday that they soon ex-pect to be treating more serious problems such as pneumonia, debydration, diarrhea and infec-tions.

The medical woes add to the The medical woes add to the daunting tasks for authorities, including dealing with looters and clearing the bottlenecks holding up thousands of tons of aid material from coming in.

ter touring Talcoban, the capital of Leyte province. Her office has released \$25 million in merragency relief fund, accounting for a chunk of the millions of dollar pledged by countries around the world.

The World Food Program dis-The World Food Program dis-tributed rice and other items to nearly 50,000 people in the Ta-cloban area Wednesday, U.N. spokesman Martin Nesirky said. While the cogs of what prom-ises to be a massive international

While the cogs of what promises to be a massive international aid effort are beginning to turn, they are not quick enough for the 600,000 people displaced, many of them homeless, hungry and thirsty.

The death toll rose to 2,344, according a national tally kept by the dissater agency. That figure is expected to rise, perhaps significantly, when accurate information is collected from the whole dissater zone, which spreads over a wide swath of the eastern and central Philippines but appears to be concentrated on two main slands—Leyte and Samar.

With the Tacloban airport battered and roads made impassable by debris, very little aid has arrived in the city. Most of fit is stuck in Manila and the nearby airport of Cebu, a 45-minute flight away.

### Wider use of cholesterol drugs urged

The nation's first new guidelines in a decade for preventing heart attacks and strokes call for twice as many Americans—one-third of all adults—to consider taking cholesterol-lowering statin drugs.
The guidelines, issued Tuesday by the American Heart Association and American College of Cardiology, are a big change. They use a new formula for estimating someone's risk that includes many factors besides cholesterol, the main focus now They take aim at strokes, not just heart aim at strokes, not just heart attacks. And they set a lower threshold for using medicines

threshold for using medicines to reduce risk.

The definition of high cholesterol isn't changing, but the treatment goal is. Instead of aiming for a spe-cific number, using whatev-

refer number, using whatever of drugs get a patient there, the advice stresses statins at Lipitor and Zocor, and identifies groups of people they help the most. "The emphasis is to try to treat more appropriately," said Dr. Nell Stone, the Northwestern University doctor who headed the Cholesterol guideline panel. "Wer going to give statins to those who are the most likely to benefit." Doctors said the new approach will limit thow many people with low heart risks are put on statins simply

people with low heart risks are put on statins simply because of a cholesterol number. Yet under the new advice, 33 million Ameri-cans — 44 percent of men and 22 percent of women — would meet the threshold to consider taking a statin Under the current guide lines, statins are recom-mended for only about 15 percent of adults.

He provided drugs to a co-He provided drugs to a co-conspirator and Huntington res-ident identified as Lindsey Alyn Thacker, 29. Thacker, also known as "Lindsey Webh," made seven trips to Detroit be-tween the summer of 2012 and June 2013 to pick up heroin and crack cocaine from Merritt. Thacker and her associate, Keith Eric Wood, 28. opened their Huntington home to store and sell heroin. A search of the home on June 20 turned up, 3 grams of heroin and more than \$1,000 cash.

Thacker and Wood pleaded guilty Nov. 5 to maintaining a home to sell heroin and each face up to 20 years in federal prison. Sentencing for all three is scheduled for Feb. 18.

He said there have been 55 civilian fire deaths in the state since Jan. I It's a figure he said was not necessarily high for the state, but was still "regrettable." He said West Virginia's fire death rate per capita is higher than every state in the nation, surpassed only by Washington, D.C.

A 2010 study by the U.S. Fire Administration showed West Virginia's fire death rate was 37.2 per million residents.

"A West Virginian is 3.3 times more likely to die in a fire than a member of the general population," Messina said. "That's a terrible statistic."

He said a variety of factors could be the cause, including careless smoking, improperly used or unsafe space heaters, or faulty heating systems. He recommended having home heating systems inspected, making sure space heaters meet the latest standards, in addition to making sure the heater is on a level surface and away from other objects.

Each bedroom should have a smoke detector and the recommended have a smo

should be at least one on each floor of a home, he said.

Those who cannot afford a smoke detector should check with their local fire department to see if low-cost or free smoke detectors are available, he said.

Families should also plan and practice according to the said.

emergencies, he said.
"Having smoke detectors and
home escape plans make a difference," Messina said.

ROSCOE, S.D. — Robert Malsam nearly went broke in the 1980s when corn was cheap. So now that prices are high and he can

that prices are high and he can finally make a profit, he's not about to apologize for ripping up prairieland to plant corn. Across the Dakotas and Ne-braska, more than 1 million acres of the Great Plains are giving way to corn fields as farmers transform the wild ex-panse that once served as the backdrop for American pio-neers.

This expansion of the Corn Belt is fueled in part by Amer-Belt is fueled in part by America's green-energy policy, which requires oil companies to blend billions of gallons of corn ethanol into their gasoline. In 2010, fuel became the No. 1 use for corn in America, a title it held in 2011 and 2012 and narrowly lost this year. That helps keep prices high.

"It's not hard to do the math there, as to what's moffishele to

there, as to what's profitable to have," Malsam said. "I think an ethanol plant is a farmer's

etnanoi piant is a tarmer's friend." What the green-energy pro-gram has made profitable, how-ever, is far from green. A poli-cy intended to reduce global warming is encouraging a farm-ing practice that actually could worsen it.

warms—

ing practice that actually count worsen it.

That's because plowing into untouched grassland releases carbon dioxide that has been naturally locked in the soil. It also increases erosion and requires farmers to use fertilizers and other industrial chemicals. In turn, that destroys native plants and whest out wildlife habitats.

It appeared so damaging that

It appeared so damaging that scientists warned that America's corn-for-ethanol policy would fail as an anti-global warming strategy if too many farmers plowed over virgin land. The Obama administration argued that would not happen, but the administration didn't set up a way to monitor if it actually happened. It did happen. More than 1.2 million acres of grassland have been lost since the federal government

of grassland have been lost since the federal government required that gasoline be blend-ed with increasing amounts of ethanol, an Associated Press analysis of satellite data found. Plots that were wild grass or pastureland seven years ago are now corn and soybean fields. That's in addition to the 5

The AP's analysis used gov-ernment satellite data to count how much grassland existed in 2006 in each county, then com-pared each plot of land to cor-responding satellite data from 2012.

The data from the LIS Geo-
